

WDAC Sponsored CRS Training Series FALL 2021

The <u>brand-new CRS/CFRS training series</u> will be held on Tuesdays for 10 weeks beginning on 9/21/21 and concluding on 11/23/21. The class is <u>free</u> for any SCA referred student to attend, but the application fees for certification (\$150 for either CRS/CFRS or \$300 for both) and any testing related costs will need to be assumed by the student or the referring employer.

- The class is currently set to "private" and the password to access the application is

- Approved students must also have a login on DDAP Training Management System https://apps.ddap.pa.gov/tms/Logon.aspx
- Students may test for CRS Certification after completing 78 hours of training including 66 classroom hours and 12 hours of work outside the classroom.
- *The hours listed here are the minimum hours necessary to complete the curriculum. Actual classroom time may vary from week to week depending on class flow. Students should arrive by 8:30 and expect to be in class to 4:30 pm each week.
