Certified Recovery Specialist (CRS) Training Series 2023

The CRS/CFRS training series will be held over 10 days beginning 3/27/23 and concluding 4/7/23. The training is funded by F.A.V.O.R.'s ARC INSPIRE initiative **Recovery to Work (R2W) Laurel Highlands** through Vital Strategies funds. There is no cost to attend. Priority seating will be given to residents of Westmoreland, Cambria, Blair, Bedford, Somerset, Huntingdon, Fayette, and Indiana counties until 2/24/23. Students and/or their employer will be responsible for the \$150 testing/PCB application fee.

- The class is currently set to "private" and the password to access the application is **R2W Laurel Highlands**
- Students may test for CRS Certification after completing 78 hours of training including 66 classroom hours and 12 hours of work outside the classroom.

*The hours listed here are the minimum hours necessary to complete the curriculum. Actual classroom time may vary from week to week depending on class flow. Students should arrive by 8:15 am and expect to be in class to 4:30 pm each day.
