



## Certified Recovery Specialist (CRS) Training Series 2026

The CRS/CFRS training series will be held over ten weeks beginning 4/10/26 and concluding 6/12/26. The training is funded by the Pennsylvania Department of Drug & Alcohol Programs (DDAP) and hosted by Blair County Drug & Alcohol Programs. We will reserve seating for Blair County residents until March 8, 2026.

There is no cost to attend. Upon completion of the class, application/testing fees for certification (\$150 for either CRS/CFRS or \$300 for both) will be the responsibility of each student.

- Once approved by facilitator, students will be directed to create an account on DDAP's Training Management System (**required for this class**)
- Students may test for CRS Certification after completing 78 hours of training including 66 classroom hours and 12 hours of work outside the classroom.

\*The hours listed here are the minimum hours necessary to complete the curriculum. Actual classroom time may vary from week to week depending on class flow. Students should arrive by 8:15 am and expect to be in class to 4:30 pm each day.
