The Sex Addiction Controversy

Is sex addiction real? Depends on whom you ask



ASAM Addiction Definition

 We all have the brain reward circuitry that makes food and sex rewarding. In fact, this is a survival mechanism. In a healthy brain, these rewards have feedback mechanisms for satiety or 'enough.' In someone with addiction, the circuitry becomes dysfunctional such that the message to the individual becomes 'more', which leads to the pathological pursuit of rewards and/or relief through the use of substances and behaviors. So, anyone who has addiction is vulnerable to food and sex addiction.

AASECT Position

- AASECT recognizes that people may experience significant physical, psychological, spiritual and sexual health corresponses related to their sexual urges, thoughts or behaviors. AASECT recommends that its members unlike models that do not unduly pathologize consensal sexual behaviors. AASECT 1) does not find sufficient empirical evidence to support the classification of sex addiction or port addiction as a mental health disorder, and 2) does not find the sexual addiction training and treatment methods and educational pedagogies to be adequately informed by accurate human sexually knowledge. Therefore, it is the position of AASECT that linking problems related to sexual urges, thoughts or behaviors to a porn/sexual addiction process cannot be advanced by AASECT as a standard of practice for sexuality education delivery. comesting of therapy.
 AASECT advacates for a collaborative movement to establish standards of care supported by science public health consensus and the regiones protection of sexual rights for consumers seeking treatment for problems related to consensus as standard practices.

Sex Addiction

Proposed DSM Definition

- A. over a period of at least 6 months recurrent and intense sexual fantasies, sexual urges, and sexual behavior in association of four or more of the following criteria: Excessive time is consumed by sexual fantasies and urges and by planning for and engaging in sexual behavior.
- sexua to enviror. Repetitively engaging in these sexual fantasies, urges and behavior in response to dysphoric mood states (e.g., anxiety, depression, boredom and irritability). Repetitively engaging in these sexual fantasies, urges and behavior in response to stressful life events.

- Repetitive and unsuccessful attempts to control or significantly reduce these sexual urges, fantasies and behaviors.
- Repetitively engaging in sexual behavior while disregarding the risk for physical or emotional harm to self or others

Proposed DSM Definition

- B. There is clinically significant personal distress or impairment in social, occupational or other important areas of functioning associated with the frequency and intensity of the sexual fantasies, urges or behavior
- C. These sexual fantasies, urges and behavior are not due to direct physiological effects of exogenous substances (e.g. drugs of abuse or medications), a co-occurring general medical condition or to a manic episode
- D. The person is at least 18 years of age

Specify if masturbation, pornography, sexual behavior with consenting adults, cybersex, telephone sex and strip clubs.

Sex Addiction Criticisms

- Not enough scientific evidence
- Religious basis
- · Pathologizes non-normative or non-hetero sexual practices
- Sex cannot be addictive

Out of Control Sexual Behavior

· Defined as a sexual problem of consensual sexual urges, thoughts, or behaviors that feel out of control for the individual

Out of Control Sexual Behavior

 "The substance of therapist OCSB interventions stem from what the client wants to achieve for his sexual health rather than the sexual-disorder symptoms he should overcome or what the therapist this is sexually appropriate."



Sexual Addiction Deficits

Affect Regulation

- Client inability to manage negative affect in a health manner
- Sexual behavior used as a coping mechanism for self regulation



Things that effect Therapist Activation regarding sexual discussions

- · Personal discomfort hearing about details of sexual behaviors
- · Personal discomfort with own sexual behavior or turn ons
- · Historical or recent sexual violation
- · Unresolved issues about own sexual decisions
- · Personal judgments about sexual behaviors

Therapist Issues

- Ford & Hendrick (2003) -
 - Therapists with a more conservative sexological worldview tended to view clients with multiple sexual encounters as having more pathology than the monogamous clients.
- Hertlein (2004)
 - Therapists who self identify as more religious are more likely to rate married client's online viewing of pornography or sex chatting as a sexual addiction.

Therapist Issues

Minor attraction

- 2010 German study found that 95% of therapists surveyed were unwilling to work with patients diagnosed with pedophilia.
- 2015 German study
 - 2015 German study Therapists workded anti-stigma training about pedophilia Decreased agreement with stereotypes Increased favorable affective response Decreased social distance NO EFFECT on therapist' willingness to trast pedophiles.

The Take Aways

- · We do NOT diagnose SA based on
 - Type of behavior
 - Our comfort with the behavior Our religious belief about the behavior
 - Our cultural belief about the behavior



The Take Aways

- We do Diagnose SA based on
 - Ability to stop the behavior
 Escalation of behavior
 - Negative effects of the behavior on the person's life
 - Excessive time spent

 - Excessive time spent
 Purpose of the behavior

 i.e. coping mechanism

 Level of compulsivity
 Excluding other MH issues
